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

Technology Enabled Care

This is an excellent tool and well worth a look if you know any one who is struggling with living at home, it can be something as small as opening a ti or taking the lid of a jar. Ask Sara contains information about products that support independence and assist people to live well in the community.







Technology Enabled Home First

Staff within the local authority are being trained to better understand the opportunities that technology offers to support people to live safely at home. As this training is rolled out there may be more opportunities for more organisations to up skill staff. This technology can be sued to monitor changes in a persons circumstances which can then be sued to alert services of the need o intervene. For example it can highlight that a person has turned over in bed and may be at risk of falling which can alert a carer to check on the person concerned.

Brain In hand:

Brain in hand is an app that enabled users to plan for social situations that might otherwise be challenging. The app has been piloted with young people who have autism of are neuro- diverseness. Users of the app have seen it as liberating, enabling them to travel freely where they might not otherwise have been able to do so.



Care Home Capital Grants :

Sefton Council have invested over£1,000,000 in improvement to Care Homes. Many of the care homes have requested funding to support them with new technology both in patient care records and in aids and adaptations to improve the quality of life of cares. the grant has been used for a variety of improvements not just tech.


